Governance and Operations ~Strength in Working Together: Board and Staff Training

Board and Staff Training: Operations vs. Governance

As part of our commitment to strong leadership and organizational excellence, our Board of Directors and staff participated in training focused on the critical distinction between governance and operations. Led by Erica Roberts, President of X is Possible, the Charities team reinforced their shared understanding of their complementary roles. This clarity helps continue to strengthen collaboration, reduce role confusion, and ensure that decision-making is both strategic and mission focused. The team was reminded that by honoring these distinctions, Charities operates with greater efficiency, transparency, and accountability - empowering us to serve our community more effectively.











Charities held its annual Board/Staff retreat, with IMPACT as its theme! During their time, the Board and Staff engaged in a series of robust conversations. Beginning with a reflection on its origin, Founding President Erma Barron led "A Conversation from the Heart". Part two offered a deeper dive into its operations through "A Conversation with the Staff." The day concluded with "A Conversation on Strategy", focusing on its future. This portion of the retreat was led by Beverly Everson-Jones, a local leader in strategy and finance.







Programmatic IMPACT:

Charities kicked off its year by serving alongside its premier partner, the Iota Gamma Omega Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. ® during the "We Are One" AKA Service Day, in collaboration with the Psi Epsilon Omega, Eta, and Theta Nu Chapters of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. ® The event had 330 attendees, and special guest Congressman Glenn Ivey. The result was the packing of 430 powerpacks for elementary school students, a collection of over 16,000 items for the Pink Pantry, as well as over 300 items for victims of Human Trafficking were collected for distribution.







The Ivy League Programs:

The Ivy League Program is a comprehensive, educational enrichment program designed to enhance the academic performance, provide leadership skills, encourage community service and engagement, and enrich the cultural development of youth in Prince George's County, with specific emphasis in the Landover and Suitland communities. The Ivy League consists of three age-based youth programs and a companion parent support system.

Popcorn Club continued to serve elementary-aged students in Prince George's County. In 2024,

Charities serviced 4 Title 1 schools in Prince George's County. The partnering schools are Allenwood Elementary, Andrew Jackson Academy, Rosa L. Parks Elementary and St. Philip the Apostle School.

Charities celebrated African American Read-In Day in February! Volunteers shared the joy of reading by reading a selected book written by an African American author to K-3rd grade students in Prince George's County.





Charities hosted regular Book Parties, including the books *King & Kayla* and the *Case of Found Fred Mystery*, at each school encouraging the love of reading.





Over 300 students were able to enjoy a STEM show titled "Gus Goes Green".

Over 100 Ivy Leaguers were celebrated during Charities annual Ivy League Awards!








Students participated in a Virtual December literary activity across 3 schools. Together, the students read "The Gingerbread Man Loose in the School" and decorated gingerbread houses.

The participants enjoyed sessions of Sip and Paint with the topic of Self Love, workshops discussing the importance of good mental health, and participating in cultural field trips.







The Institute for the Growth and Development of All America's Youth (GADAAY) is designed to assist both female and male high school students in the preparation for college and careers.



During the year, students invited seasoned members of the community to create floral arrangements as they discussed generational differences, similarities, and advice. They also had time to utilize their critical thinking during an afternoon at Escapology!

Parents on Track is a parental networking program offering monthly networking and training opportunities for parents to help them advocate for their children on critical issues related to education, health, finances, government and economic resources. Established in 2000, Charities' put a spotlight on parents to help them find and use the requisite skills and resources to effectively advocate for their children on matters related to academics, health, financial literacy and social adjustment.

Charities focus on Generational Success!

Shoe Bank is the longest-running service program offered by Charities. Through Shoe Bank,

62 families were able to select and take home brand new shoes for school! A special thank you to our JC Penny's partner!

Family Strengthening continued to be a provider to many of those in need. More than

\$5000 worth of donations have been provided to Sheperd's Cove, Community Crisis Services, and our adopted families.

43 gifts were purchased for our Adopted Families Angel Tree initiative.



CHIPP: In 2024, CHIPP provided **4,856** powerpacks to **315** students at Princeton Elementary School. These packs assist in warding off weekend hunger many children experience throughout the County.

Sunshine Club continued to provide SUNSHINE and JOY while orchestrating recreational activities for the residents at Forestville Rehabilitation Center in Prince George's County, housing at least 150 residents.

Highlights of Ivy VINE Cohort 1 Achievements

<u>Goal</u>: 80% of participating nonprofits will attend at least 80% of the training provided each program year

Result: 5 out of 6 nonprofits attended all of the training = 83%

<u>Goal:</u> 80% of participating nonprofits will attend at least 40 hours of capacity building coaching sessions each year

Result: 5 out of 6 nonprofits participated in at least 40 hours of coaching sessions = 83%

<u>Goal:</u> 80% of participating nonprofits earn the Maryland Nonprofits Standards for Excellence (SFE) Basics Level by the end of the two-year program

<u>Result:</u> 2 out of 6 nonprofits earned SFE recognition = 33% (one partner achieved Basics Enhanced)

<u>Goal:</u> 80% of participating nonprofits receive at least \$5,000 in grants within two years <u>Result:</u> 4 out of 6 received at least \$5K from Ivy VINE = 67%!



Outcome-Based Reviews

In addition to the pre-assessment vs. post-assessment results, the nonprofit partners completed a survey at the end of the year regarding the overall program that was conducted by the Ivy VINE. The results of the nonprofit partners' survey are summarized below.



- 1. Prior to the Ivy VINE program, only one of the nonprofit partners had met or spoken with a Prince George's County elected official. Since participating in the Ivy VINE program, all the nonprofit leaders have met with at least one Council Member, and one had the opportunity to meet Maryland's First Lady, Mrs. Dawn Moore, at a County event where Charities sponsored the nonprofit partner's attendance.
- 2. Prior to the Ivy VINE program, only one of the nonprofit partners had submitted a grant application for funding to a local official. Since participating in the Ivy VINE program, all the nonprofit leaders have submitted applications to at least one Council Member. By the end of 2024, all who applied received at least one grant from County officials.
- **3.** At the time of their application to the Ivy VINE, all nonprofit partners stated that their Board of Directors was in flux, was not engaged or had not met. Since participating in the Ivy VINE program, each of the nonprofit organizations has revamped or enhanced their Board with new members who have participated in at least one retreat designed to enhance Board engagement.
- **4.** Prior to the Ivy VINE, only one of the nonprofit partners was aware of Maryland Nonprofits' Standards for Excellence recognition program. As a result of participating in the Ivy VINE, one nonprofit partner earned recognition at the Basics level and one earned recognition at the Basics Enhanced level. Two other organizations are expected to apply in 2025.
- **5**. Prior to the Ivy VINE, none of the nonprofit partners had received structured executive coaching. As a result of the Ivy VINE, the nonprofits received up to 5 hours of coaching every month and credit their coaches for their success. Two Executive Directors stated their intent to continue the services of their coach at their own expense beyond the program.


